

Throughout the year, we may make changes to our list of covered drugs (formulary). Changes usually occur to add generic versions of covered brand-name drugs, remove drugs that are considered unsafe by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), or remove drugs that are no longer made. We generally remove brand-name drugs from our drug list when the generic equivalent is added but may also move the drug to a higher cost-share tier, add new restrictions, or both. Below is the list of changes to our drug list as of the date at the bottom of the page.
